Thank you for your support as a member of SS Peter and Paul's Church over the past year. Working together as a congregation, we have:

- continued to enjoy a wide range of Sunday Services and have enjoyed a Flower Festival
- continued to reach out to families through launching Active Church at WFCC
- run our first Alpha and Christianity Explored courses
- launched our website www.dochurch.org.uk
- developed greater links with Ospringe CofE Primary School

Alongside all these initiatives is the ongoing ministry to our own members and the wider community. These and all our other activities continue on a daily basis supported by the faithfulness of church members. This year we face the task of replacing our current Church Boiler and a significant portion of our Church Roof. We give a hearty thanks to the 'Friends of Ospringe Church' whose hearty efforts assist us in maintaining the fabric of the church.

We have not had a stewardship campaign for a number of years. With the appointment of a new parish priest, whom we share with Davington and the Diocesan appointment of Bishops Missioner and different projects on the horizon, it seemed a good time for us to review our finances. At a time when the general economic situation might not look encouraging, it is perhaps particularly appropriate for us to review our financial priorities. By reflecting on how important our faith and church are to us we can determine the extent to which our giving can ensure that SS Peter and Paul's continues to be a living worshipping community with a Parish Priest. Most of us review our finances annually and it seems prudent to plan our giving to the church in a similar way. This would involve reviewing our giving in the context of our own, and the church's, changing financial situation as part of an annual act of thanksgiving.

An annual renewal will provide an opportunity to give thanks for God's generosity to us and to commit afresh to supporting His work in Ospringe. Revd Tracey spoke on God's faithfulness and generosity to us in July and if you would like to read of this, please visit our website www.dochurch.org.uk or ask her for a copy. Sunday 28th September 1115 during our Harvest Festival we will be having a special time of thanksgiving for God's generosity to us and for our response in helping to meet this year's challenges.

The PCC manages the budget very carefully and in this year alone has made several savings through 'tightening their belts', but we still need to increase our giving by some £200 a month to keep pace with costs, let alone financing our maintenance projects. Church members are often unaware of the income and outgoings of the church and on occasions have blamed the National Church or Diocese 'for taking all of our money'. Our Parish Share is affected by members on our electoral roll. As one such member you have taken a specific interest in our church and we hope you may feel able to contribute towards your church.

Our Planned Giving and Gift Aid Schemes are organised to ensure confidentiality between you and those directly involved in running them. I hope very much that you are able to make a commitment to regular giving to SS Peter and Paul's. If so, please complete the form and return it to the Treasurer by **28th September**.
